

Market Insurance and Permits For Stall Holders – Legal Requirements

This is a brief summary – please refer to page 12 of the Charter Documents for full details of the legal requirements of Stall Holders

In summary;

1. Any stall selling food or beverages must have a Clarence City Council issued Temporary Food Permit or Food Notification Form. This can take a few weeks to obtain. These can be downloaded from the Clarence City Council website.
2. Value-added foods must be prepared in a council approved kitchen.
3. All stall holders must have a sign (A4 page, usually in a frame) with the vendors name and address displayed on their stall.
4. Prices of all items must be clearly marked
5. Food products must comply with FSANZ labelling regulations (visit www.foodstandards.gov.au)
6. If selling alcohol or offering wine tastings you require a liquor licence and RSA (responsible serving of alcohol permit). If you do not have a liquor licence for premises other than your own we can still accommodate you for a small extra fee. Please contact us.
7. All stall holders – fresh food, value added, craft, arts, plants or ready to eat will require their own Public Liability Insurance. This can sometimes be included for a small additional fee on your existing policy, or alternatively visit www.webinsure.com.au or www.netinsure.com.au or any other insurance broker or business. If you are a one-off stall holder and this is not viable, please contact us.
8. Stall holders providing food or produce (including fresh vegetables) must have Product Liability insurance. This can sometimes be included for a small additional fee on your existing policy, or alternatively visit www.webinsure.com.au or www.netinsure.com.au or any other insurance broker or business.
